Updated COVID-19 Policy

As COVID-19 becomes a more normalized part of our lives, Contra Costa County has relaxed the guidelines for child care facilities.

In the event of a positive case, the following process is required:

Must isolate to prevent the spread of COVID; stay home for at least 5 days from when you tested positive for COVID-19. You will no longer need to isolate after day 5 if:


- Symptoms are not present, or are mild and improving; AND
- You are fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication). If you have a fever, isolation should be continued until 24 hours after fever resolves without the use of fever-reducing medications.

If you can end your isolation after day 5 wear a well-fitted mask around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings, and continue to follow other preventive measures and masking guidance.

There is no need to test to end isolation after Day 5 of a positive case.

Of course we strongly recommend being vigilant in protecting your family and our community. If your child has any symptoms of illness, they need to stay home. The complete and updated DVMS COVID Policy is attached for your review.
