## **DVMS Health Policy**

In the past weeks the number of illness has increased significantly. It's simply that time of year. Unfortunately with children, a seemingly benign runny nose, rash, or ear ache can quickly escalate into more serious conditions. Last year many children were impacted by RSV, some requiring hospitalization. It was a scary time as we all care so deeply for our children.

Our teachers know your children. They carefully observe for any signs of illness, lack of energy, and need for extra loving care. We always want to be with the children, yet there are times when we know when a child is not able to participate meaningfully. The decision to send a child home is not made lightly, rather with care to consider the child's overall health and the well-being of every person in the classroom.

DVMS is a community of respect. Our actions impact everyone. The teachers do their best to protect the environment so that it is focused on learning. We want to keep the classroom healthy for everyone so that children can continue to attend and the teachers are there to provide consistent care and guidance.

We understand that it is difficult to rearrange routines and schedules when a child is sick and needs to stay home. Giving your child the chance to recover at home is essential for many reasons. First of all, they need time to get better. Returning to school when they are not fully ready is stressful for our little ones. Secondly, when children are sick at school, other children and teachers are at risk of becoming ill, creating a domino effect for other families and staff.

Our DVMS Health policy is for the benefit of everyone. Key points to remember: \*a child must be fever-free without medication for at least 24 hours before returning to school

\*if a child vomits or has diarrhea, they need to stay home for 24 hours after the illness passes

\*if your child has been diagnosed with a communicable illness such as RSV, impetigo, or pink eye, <u>you must notify the DVMS office ASAP</u> so we can distribute a communicable disease notice to families and notify licensing and CCPH when appropriate

\*if your child is taking any medication for an infectious condition, they must stay home while they are still infectious

\*excessive runny noses and coughs are sufficient reason for a teacher to send a child home if they feel it necessary
